The Conference

Each of you will act as BOTH an historical figure AND a journalist. We will have a series of "conferences" on a few issues: Hamilton's financial plan, the national bank, and major domestic issues (slavery, the location of the capital, the role of the President), foreign relations, and the election of 1800 (be sure to bring up the Alien and Sedition Acts). You will be an historical figure for one of the conferences and a journalist for the others. If you are a Federalist historical figure, you will be a Federalist journalist and if you are a Democratic-Republican historical figure, you will be a Democratic-Republican journalist.

When you are an historical figure, you must make a one minute opening statement on the issues AND you must be prepared to answer the journalists' questions. The journalists must write three questions for each of the conferences for which they will be a journalist. The journalists are partisan (just as they were at the time) and their questions should either make the members of their party look good OR they should seek to point out the weaknesses of the other side. The journalists' questions should be directed at specific historical figures. Make this clear at the beginning of the question.
