

<b>DEADLINE</b>	<b>SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTION</b>
<b>January 22, 2003</b>	<b>Appalachian State University Seby Jones Scholarship</b> – RCHS may nominate one student to compete for this scholarship. The applicant should show evidence of and be an active participant in school and community activities and should provide evidence of leadership potential, exhibit sound and purposeful ambition, stand for right, be vigorous and diligent in pursuit of duty, and show compassion for others. Applicants must complete the application and write a one page typed autobiographical essay stressing the things you think have been most important and influential upon you and describing your most productive and creative work. Applications are available in the CC office and must be returned to Mrs. Atkinson no later than January 22, 2003. The scholarship committee will choose the school nominee by January 28.
<b>January 26, 2003</b>	<b>The Jagannathan Scholarship</b> – RCHS may nominate one student. Applicant must plan to enroll in one of the constituent University of North Carolina institutions. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of outstanding academic achievement, financial need, extra-curricular activities and leadership qualities. Students of employees of TIEPET Inc., Universal Fibers, and related companies may apply through the personnel director of the company that employs their parents – a nomination is not needed. Applicants must register for the CSS Profile using the Scholarship Code #0093 prior to January 26 to be eligible for the scholarship. <b>January 31, 2003</b>	<b>Papa John's Scholarship</b> – Anyone with a 2.5 GPA or higher may apply. The selection committee will consider the following categories when selecting winners: life goals and interests, demonstrated leadership, quality of character, athletic achievement, obstacles overcome, creative ability, community involvement, academic achievement, meaningful objectives achieved. The award is \$1,000. One national winner will receive \$10,000. Applications are available in the CC office. <b>February 1, 2003</b>	<b>Elon University Leon and Lorraine Watson North Carolina Scholarship</b> - Must be a North Carolina resident graduating from a North Carolina high school, demonstrate a high financial need, have a strong record of academic achievement. Preference will be given to students who are the first members of their family to attend college, have achieved success despite hardship or unusual challenge, will bring cultural or socio-economic diversity to the university, exhibit excellent potential to benefit from the opportunities of an Elon education and the Watson Scholarship program. The award is \$5,000 in addition to other grants, Application available to Elon applicants in the CC office.
<b>February 10, 2003</b>	<b>Prospective Teacher Scholarship Loan Program, 2003-2004</b> – The NC Prospective Teacher Scholarship Loan Program makes available \$2500 a year to individuals preparing to teach in NC schools. Applications are available at <a href="http://www.ncpublicschools.org/scholarships">www.ncpublicschools.org/scholarships</a> . To be eligible, applicants must plan to enroll full-time in a college or university with an approved education program or a community college for studies leading to a transfer to a college or university with an approved teacher education program.
<b>February 15, 2003</b>	<b>American Chemical Society Scholars Program and Co-Sponsoring Organizations</b> – Candidates must be African-American, Hispanic/Latino or American Indian, a U.S. citizen, a high school senior intending to major in chemistry, biochemistry, chemical engineering or a chemistry related degree program and planning a career in the chemical sciences or chemical technology, able to demonstrate evidence of financial need according to FAFSA form, and high academic achievers in chemistry or science. The award is \$2500 per year for freshmen. Application available in CC office.

- February 28, 2003**      **Eagle Scout Scholarships** – The Elks National Foundation awards eight Eagle Scout scholarships each year to a registered Eagle Scout and a high school senior. Criteria: SAT score of at least 1090 or ACT score of 26, and financial need. Awards: Four \$8,000 and four \$4,000. - February 28, 2003**      **Kiwanis Club of Cary Scholarship** – Graduating seniors that reside in the Cary-Apex area may apply. Applicants must also adhere to the objectives of Kiwanis International. Application available in CC office
- March 15, 2003**      **NFIB Free Enterprise Scholars Award** – High School seniors or any student entering his freshman year at an accredited, nonprofit two or four year university, college or vocational/technical institute may apply. The applicant should demonstrate entrepreneurial spirit and initiative, such as starting his or her own business, participation in organizations such as DECA, Junior Achievement, and the National Foundation for Teaching Entrepreneurship, among others, or through other initiatives. Must be nominated by a dues paying member of the National Federation of Independent Business. - April 1, 2003**      **Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation** – You can qualify for scholarships if you are the son or daughter of a Marine on active duty or in the Reserve, the son or daughter of a former Marine or Marine Reservist who has received an Honorable Discharge, Medical Discharge, or who was killed while in the service of our country, the son or daughter of an active duty, reserve, or former U. S. Navy Corpsman who is serving or has served, with the U. S. Marine Corps and your 2002 family income is \$54, 000 or less.
