March 15, 2003	NFIB Free Enterprise Scholars Award – High School seniors or any student entering his freshman year at an accredited, nonprofit two or four year university, college or vocational/technical institute may apply. The applicant should demonstrate entrepreneurial spirit and initiative, such as starting his or her own business, participation in organizations such as DECA, Junior Achievement, and the National Foundation for Teaching Entrepreneurship, among others, or through other initiatives. Must be nominated by a dues paying member of the National Federation of Independent Business. Applications are available in CC office or online at www.nfibeducationfoundation.org .
April 1, 2003	Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation – You can qualify for scholarships if you are the son or daughter of a Marine on active duty or in the Reserve, the son or daughter of a former Marine or Marine Reservist who has received an Honorable Discharge, Medical Discharge, or who was killed while in the service of our country, the son or daughter of an active duty, reserve, or former U. S. Navy Corpsman who is serving or has served, with the U. S. Marine Corps and your 2002 family income is \$54, 000 or less. April 2, 2003	Brentwood Extension & Community Association Scholarship – Applicants must be resident of Wake County, continuing education at a North Carolina college, university, community or technical school, have a GPA of 2.5 or better, and must submit 3 recommendations. Award is \$500. Application available in Mrs. Atkinson’s office.
April 10, 2003	Gingiss Formalwear Scholarship – Requirements are a 300-word essay which describes an incident wherein you emerged as a leader and influenced a group of people. The essay will be judged on the basis of authenticity of information, clarity of expression and thoughts and use of correct English grammar; a list of all school activities ; a list of involvement in community activities; and list of paid work experience including responsibilities and any leadership roles; a copy of your latest transcript. The award is 1 scholarship for \$1000 and 4 for \$500. Application available in Mrs. Atkinson’s office. (RCHS had a winner last year)
May 1, 2003	Girl Scout Gold Award – For young women who have achieved the highest ranking in Girl Scouting. Criteria: academics, activities, leadership, community involvement and pursuit of individual interest. Award: Eight \$6,000 awards.
