Public education funding remains low.

- When adjusted for inflation, average teacher salaries have decreased by more than 5% in the past 10 years.*
- N.C. ranked 38th in the U.S. for teacher pay and 41st for per-pupil funding for the 2022-23 school year.*
- Wake County provides a salary increase for National Board Certified Teachers, which
 means many RCHS teachers are making 5-7% less teaching at RCHS than they would in
 the Wake County Public School System.
- · Additionally, RCHS teachers are not part of the State Retirement plan.

RCHS teachers are high-qualified, experienced, and dedicated.

- 70% of RCHS teachers hold advanced degrees
- · RCHS teachers have an average of 19 years of classroom experience
- More than half of our teachers have taught at RCHS for $15~{\rm years}$ or more

- · Advise many clubs and student organizations, including on nights and weekends
- Design and conduct Flex Day and Community Work Day programs
- Provide 1:1 support to students outside of class and school hours
- · Write dozens of college recommendation letters each fall
